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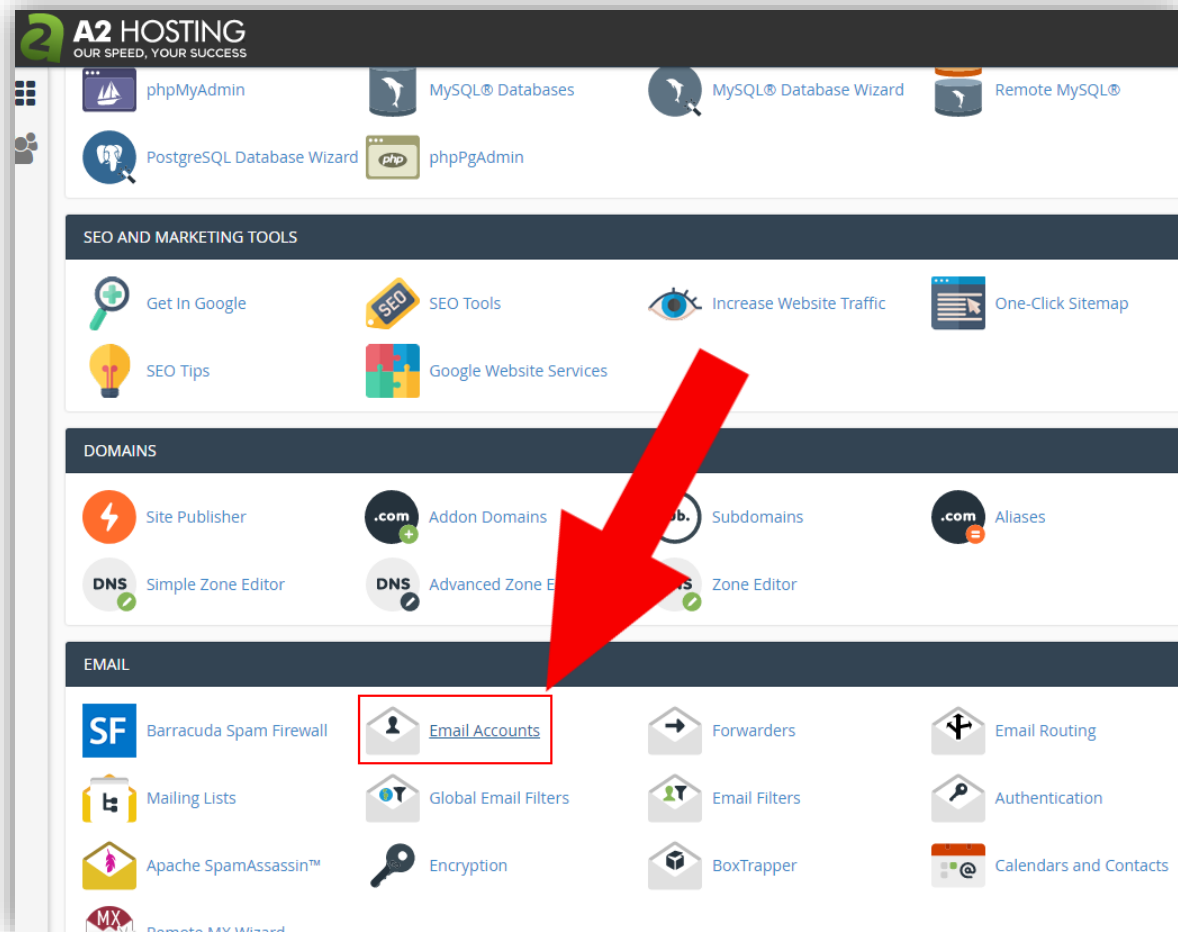
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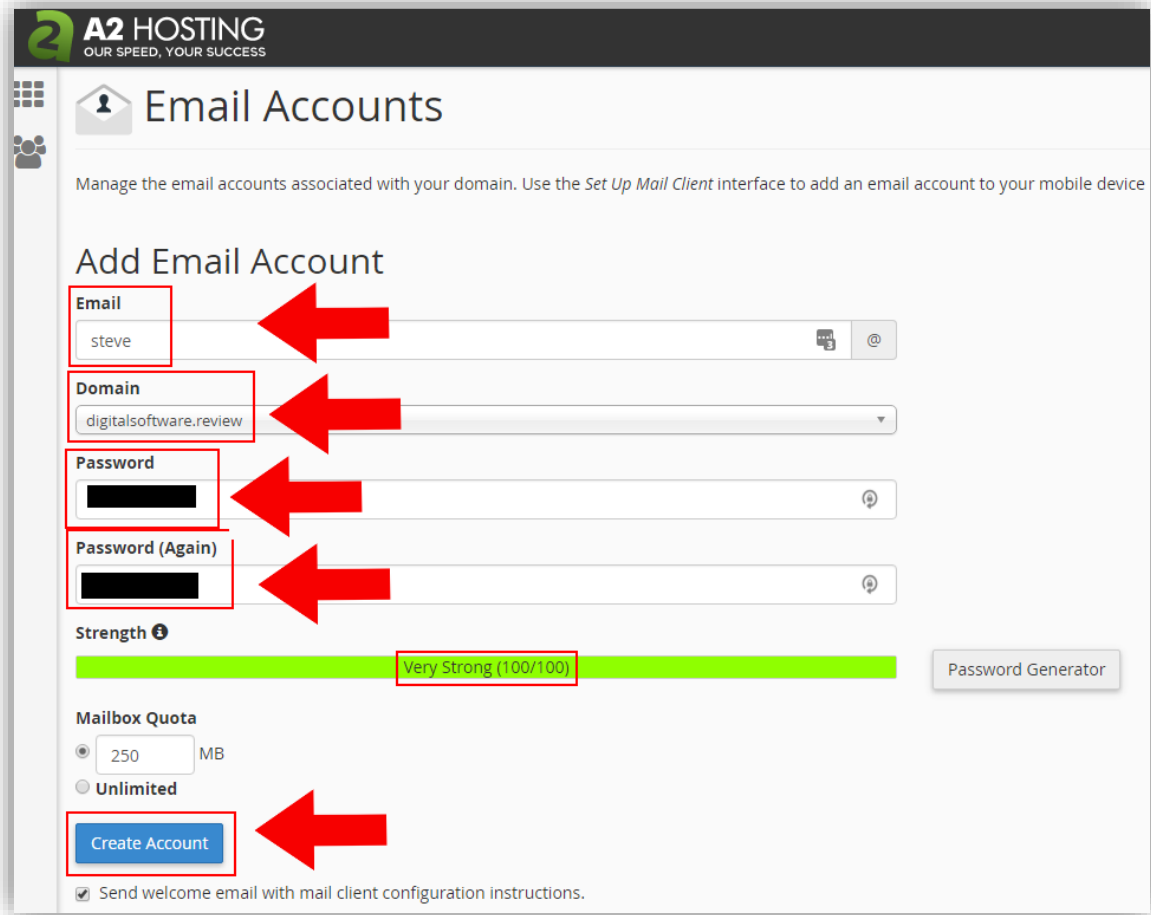
## Creating Your Domain Email

In this quick guide we'll create your domain email account which you can use to send and receive emails, and most importantly, to use with your autoresponder.

The first thing you need to do is login to your A2 Hosting account then login to the cPanel.



In the cPanel, look for the Email section then click on “Email Accounts”.



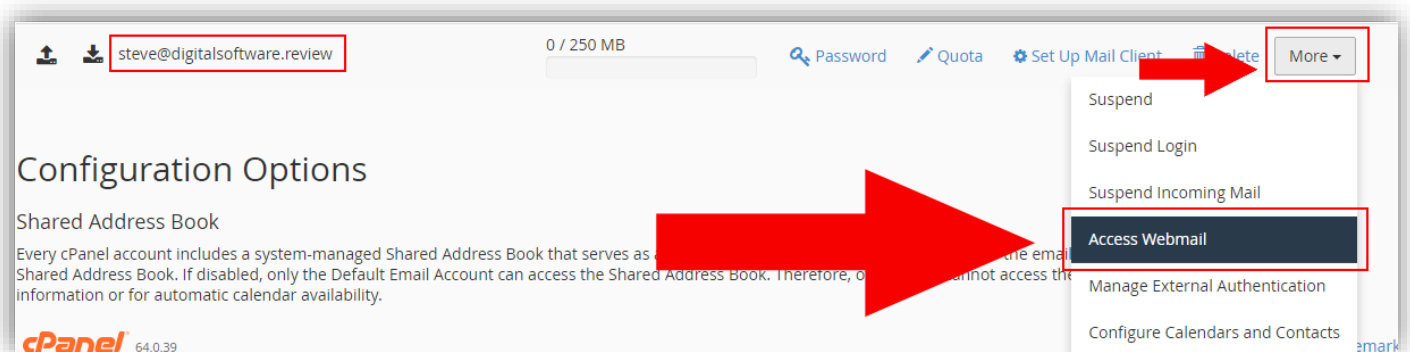
Inside the email accounts section, you can now create your email account for your domain.  
(yourname@yourdomain.com)

Fill out each of the options, name, password etc.

Try to aim for 100/100 for the password strength.

When you're done, click on "Create Account".

## Accessing Your Email

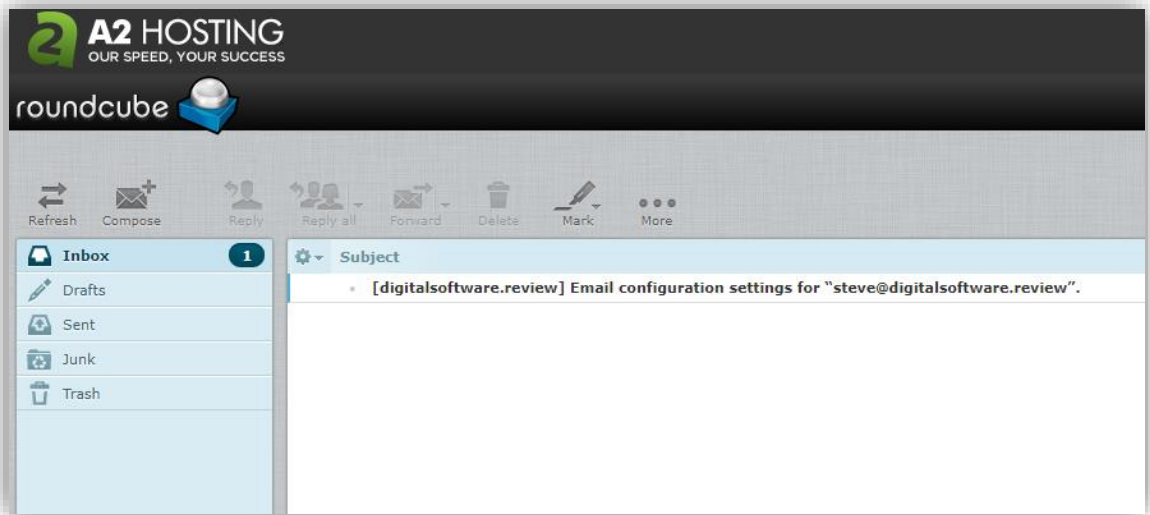


To access your email account, in the "Email Accounts" section of your cPanel, find your email address and click on the "More" button.

From the drop-down click on "Access Webmail".



You can now choose any of the above applications to view and send emails. They are all pretty similar, so it doesn't matter which one you choose.
